Why is Burkina Faso launching a solar power plant in Komsilga?

Loading... In a significant step towards enhancing electricity supply and sustainable development, Burkina Faso signs an agreement for a 50 MWp solar power plant in Komsilga. The initiative, led by the Minister of Energy and Energie Plus, aims to fortify renewable energy contributions, fostering economic growth and improved access to electricity.

How much solar power does Burkina Faso have?

Burkina Faso had just 62 MW of installed PV at the end of 2020. The World Bank has agreed to support Burkina Faso's Sustainable Renewables Risk Mitigation Initiative (SRMI) to improve access to electricity in rural areas with \$168 million.

Will a 50 MWp solar power plant bolster Burkina Faso's electricity supply strategy?

In a pivotal move to bolster Burkina Faso's electricity supply strategy, the Minister of Energy, Mines, and Quarries, Simon-Pierre BOUSSIM, and Serge CONSEIGA, General Director of Energie Plus, sealed an agreement for the construction of a 50-megawatt peak (50 MWp) solar power plant in the commune of Komsilga, Burkina Faso.

Will Burkina Faso invest \$400 million in solar?

"This new scheme will enable Burkina Faso to mobilize more than \$400 million in private investment in solar production and innovative battery storage systems," added Alexis Madelain, project team leader at the World Bank.

Why is Burkina Faso launching a new energy project?

"This new project is in line with our strategy for the Sahel, which aims to double the rate of access to electricity by 2025, especially in rural areas, and to create the conditions for more private financing in the energy sector," explained Maimouna Mbow Fam, World Bank operations manager for Burkina Faso.

What will Burkina Faso's solar funds be used for?

The funds will be used to implement the country's Large Scale Solar and Rural Electrification Project. They will also support the government in outlining an upcoming tender for 325 MW of solar coupled with 335 MWh of storage capacity. Burkina Faso had just 62 MW of installed PV at the end of 2020.

West Africa's biggest solar power plant goes onstream on Wednesday as Burkina Faso, one of the world's poorest countries, inaugurates a novel scheme to boost renewables and cut energy dependence on its neighbours.

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Energy, mines and quarries minister Bachir Ismaïl Ouedraogo and economy, finance and development minister Lassan Kabore signed an agreement with World Bank Group country manager Maimouna Fam in mid-July covering financing for a solar rural electrification project (Soleer).

Burkina Faso's transitional parliament endorses a EUR45.7 million loan agreement with China's Export-Import Bank, earmarked for the development of the Donsin solar power plant and its accompanying electricity storage system.

The aim is to increase access to clean energy by improving the financial viability of, and promoting large-scale commercial investment in, solar photovoltaic minigrids in Burkina Faso. The project will also support the government's COVID-19 recovery efforts and strengthen the resilience of vulnerable communities by supporting livelihoods and ...

The scheme incorporates almost 130,000 solar panels - 1,800 mounting structures with 72 modules each, plus 32 inverters. The Zagtouli power plant illustrates the commitment at state level to diversifying Burkina Faso's energy mix. The country aims to meet 30% of its electricity needs from photovoltaic solar panels by 2025-2030.

The solar power plant at Zagtouli: Construction of a solar power plant of 33 MWc at Zagtouli was the first experience with diversifying the sources of electricity generation in Burkina Faso. The extension project will increase production by 22.5 MWc while improving the national energy mix.

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
