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The aim of the Electricity Storage Policy Framework for Ireland is to clarify the role of electricity storage systems (ESS) in Ireland's climate objectives and energy transition. In 2019 the Climate Action Plan identified electricity storage as a key element in achieving

The Electricity Storage Policy Framework for Ireland. This is a strategic initiative aimed at transforming Ireland's energy infrastructure. As the use of renewable energy sources increases, so too does the challenge of managing the intermittent nature of these energy sources and ensuring that a stable energy infrastructure is in place.

Ireland is targeted to see significant growth in renewables in the next decades working towards a net zero energy system. Most of the added capacity will come from intermittent sources such as wind and solar making development of Long Duration Energy Storage (LDES) pivotal to enable a secure and stable net zero grid.

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Renewable Energy Ireland has published the response it made to the consultation, concluded in January, on the development of an Energy Storage Policy Framework for Ireland. Dr Tanya Harrington, Chairperson of Renewable Energy Ireland, said: "Energy storage will be critical to Ireland's energy transition.

Electricity storage, which entails capturing energy produced at one time for future use, provides an essential form of low carbon flexibility and will be an integral component of an electricity sector with high renewable penetration.
