

How much electricity does Luxembourg use?

Luxembourg is a net energy importer; 81.5% of the electricity consumed in the country, for example, was imported from neighboring European countries in 2021.

How can Luxembourg achieve zero emissions by 2050?

In order to achieve this objective, it is imperative to aim for and reach the objectives of zero emissions by 2050 and the transition to 100% renewable energy. The Integrated National Energy and Climate Plan (PNEC, Plan national intégré en matière d'énergie et de climat) provides the basis for Luxembourg's climate and energy policy.

Is Luxembourg a net energy importer?

Luxembourg is a net energy importer; 81.5% of the electricity consumed in the country, for example, was imported from neighboring European countries in 2021. There was no decline in the climate change gas emissions (CO₂) from year 2008 to 2012 in Luxembourg. There was no better efficiency in the use of electricity from 2008 to 2012.

Is biomass a source of electricity in Luxembourg?

Traditional biomass - the burning of charcoal, crop waste, and other organic matter - is not included. This can be an important source in lower-income settings. Luxembourg: How much of the country's electricity comes from nuclear power? Nuclear power - alongside renewables - is a low-carbon source of electricity.

What are the 5 dimensions of Luxembourg's climate plan?

This plan has 5 dimensions in which Luxembourg can act: research, innovation and competitiveness. In order to achieve the objectives of the Paris Agreement, the national climate objective for Luxembourg is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 55% by 2030.

Luxembourg aims to increase the share of renewables in final energy consumption to 35-37% in 2030 (11.7% in 2021), including 40.3% for heating (12.9% in 2021), 37.3% for electricity (14.2%), and 18% for transport (8%).
