

Does Myanmar use solar power?

Myanmar has rich technical solar power potential, which is the highest in the Greater Mekong Subregion. However, in terms of installed capacity, Myanmar lags largely behind Thailand and Vietnam. Even so, the country does utilize solar power.

Who owns a 20 MW solar plant in Myanmar?

Green Power Energy (GPE), a subsidiary of Myanmar's Gold Energy, said in late December that it had started operating a 20 MW solar plant in Myit Thar, Myanmar. GPE built the project on a build-own-operate (BOO) basis, after winning a bid in Myanmar's second tender for utility-scale PV projects.

How does a solar system work in Myanmar?

The solar system is introduced at two sites in Yangon City. The generated power is sold to companies at each site. This project promotes the diffusion of renewable energy to Myanmar society, and contributes to the reduction of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions.

Where is Myanmar's first solar power plant located?

Myanmar's first solar power plant is located in Minbu, Magway Division. The plant produced 40 megawatts (MW) of electricity in its first phase of operations and will produce 170 MW once fully operational.

Why did GPE build a solar power plant in Myanmar?

GPE built the project on a build-own-operate (BOO) basis, after winning a bid in Myanmar's second tender for utility-scale PV projects. The country's second tender was launched in June 2021 - just a few months after Myanmar's military coup in February. It was aimed at independent power producers (IPP) and BOO projects.

What is Myanmar's first solar tender?

It was aimed at independent power producers (IPP) and BOO projects. Myanmar launched its first solar tender in May 2020. The Taung Daw Gwin project features 45,980 PV modules from an undisclosed manufacturer and 1,500 V string inverters from Chinese manufacturer Sungrow.

In order to meet the local demand of electricity supply, it's planned to generate electricity without having to provide land for the installation of Solar Rooftop Photovoltaic (PV) systems on the roofs of homes and buildings in urban area and the solar system for the development of small and medium scale industries.

Since 2023, GEAPP has mobilized over \$4.2 million to finance projects in Myanmar, achieving 5 MW of rooftop solar projects and creating 1,500 jobs. This is a crucial step to address Myanmar's energy access gap, where per capita electricity consumption is 80% lower than the ASEAN average, and build resilience in critical economic sectors.

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Solar power in Myanmar has the potential to generate 51,973.8 TWh/year, with an average of over 5 sun hours per day. Even though most electricity is produced from hydropower in Myanmar, the country has rich technical solar power potential that is the highest in the Greater Mekong Subregion; however, in terms of installed capacity Myanmar lags largely behind Thailand and Vietnam.
