

Why is Iran in a energy crisis?

Although Iran has one of the biggest supplies of natural gas and crude oil in the world, it is in a full-blown energy crisis that can be attributed to years of sanctions, mismanagement, aging infrastructure, wasteful consumption -- and targeted attacks by Israel.

Is Iran in a energy emergency?

Although Iran has one of the biggest supplies of natural gas and crude oil in the world, it finds itself in a full blown energy emergency, coming just as it also suffers major geopolitical setbacks. Why is Iran Facing a gas crunch?

The gas crunch adds to the growing list of strains on Iran's economy. The country is one of the world's biggest oil and gas producers, but has been plagued by significant energy shortages caused by years of US sanctions and chronic under-investment in power infrastructure. The government is also under pressure internationally.

Did Iran inherited a depleted energy store?

Mr. Pezeshkian, elected president in July, has said that his government inherited a depleted energy store that it has not been able to replenish. Natural gas accounts for about 70 percent of Iran's sources of energy, a rate much higher than those in the United States and Europe, according to international energy studies.

Will Tehran schools be open on Saturday?

By Thursday, the government said all schools and higher education would move online, a measure not taken since the pandemic, for the remainder of the semester, which runs for about three more weeks. Then, on Friday, the governor of Tehran said schools there would be open on Saturday because of final exams.

What is Pezeshkian doing to reduce energy consumption in Iran?

Mr. Pezeshkian has started a video campaign of officials and celebrities urging Iranians to reduce energy consumption by lowering the temperature of their homes at least two degrees. Videos on state media showed the presidential compound with no lights at night.

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1 ???#0183; Seventy percent of Iran's energy comes from natural gas, with 90% of Iranians relying on gas for heating and cooking. Most Iranian power plants run on natural gas. Iran needs about 350 million cubic meters of natural gas a day to function. With overnight winter temperatures in the 30s and 40s Fahrenheit, demand has spiked.

Iran's energy crisis hits "dire" point as industries are forced to shut down. Iran's energy crisis deepened. Power plants shut down. Government offices, schools, and businesses closed. The nation faced widespread blackouts. Officials blamed sanctions, mismanagement, and Israeli sabotage. Emergency gas reserves dwindled.
