Is renewable capacity growing in Ukraine?

Installed renewable capacity in Ukraine is growing. This was the message from Maksym Sysoiev, partner at global law firm Dentons, at the 'Large Scale Solar Summit Central Eastern Europe' (LSS CEE) late last year, hosted by PV Tech Power publisher, Solar Media. "Despite the odds," Sysoiev added, new solar plants are being implemented and completed.

How has Russia impacted Ukraine's solar power industry?

From pv magazine 06/23 The Ukrainian solar power industry has sustained huge losses during the 15 months of fierce hostilities that have followed Russia's invasion, including almost daily barrages of rocket strikes, kamikaze drone attacks, and artillery shelling.

Should Ukrainian businesses invest in solar power?

Building a solar plant to meet self-consumption requirements, however, is simple and can secure substantial benefits. Ukrainian businesses pay, on average, roughly UAH 5.50/kWh (\$0.15) of electricity. The farm that is getting 1 megawatt's worth of solar panels on its roofs, for example, spends the equivalent of about 500 euros per hour on electricity, Kolisnyk estimates.

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According to (Sotnyk, 2021), annual O& M costs were assumed at 1.5% and the decommissioning cost at 5% of initial investment costs. Solar panels prices have risen 8%-9% in the last one month since the breakout of the Russia-Ukraine conflict and are set to rise more with the implementation of basic customs duty on modules and solar cells.
